To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is being provided as evidence of the County of Westchester's financial security in support of any indemnity, contained in any agreement between the County of Westchester and the Town of Ossining for the provision of supplemental police services, which is subject to the approval of both the Westchester County Board of Legislators and the Westchester County Board of Acquisition and Contract.

The County of Westchester is self-funding its casualty and liability exposures in accordance with Local Law 6-1986 that amended the Laws of Westchester County to add a new Chapter 295 providing for the establishment and management of a liability and casualty reserve fund. Contribution to this dedicated reserve fund is actuarially determined and reviewed on an annual basis for the adequacy of reserves.

Current assets exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00.)

It should be noted that County is in a position to obtain traditional insurance where self-funding is not appropriate or applicable.



Questionnaire Addendum

Westchester County Department of Public Safety

Question Five

On all shifts the Westchester County Department of Public Safety provides first-line supervision in the form of an on-duty sergeant-patrol supervisor. There are typically two or three such supervisors operating in the field at any given time. On all shifts, the Department provides second-line supervision, in the form of an on-duty lieutenant-tour commander. There is typically one such second-line supervisor operating in the field at any given time. In addition, there are often additional sergeants and lieutenants on duty in capacities other than patrol duties who may be called upon to fulfil such duties should the need for additional supervision arise.

In addition, the Department has command-level supervision, either on duty or on call, available an all shifts.

With respect to the patrol coverage structure described in page 4 of the request for proposal, the Department will continue its current patrol coverage model for the unincorporated portion of the Town of Ossining, to wit:

- DAY SHIFT
 - o one police officer in a patrol car between the hours of 7:00 am and 3:00 pm
 - o one police officer in a patrol car between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm
- EVENING SHIFT
 - one police officer in a patrol car between the hours of 3:00 pm and 11:00 pm
 - o one police officer in a patrol car between the hours of 4:00 pm and 12:00 am
- NIGHT SHIFT
 - o one police officer in a patrol car between the hours of 11:30 pm and 7:30 am

This coverage is achieved by allocating the services of ten police officers to unincoproated Town service. In addition, one detective is allocated to the Town to investigate Town criminal matters. 911 call taking and dispatching services will also be provided 24/7 with multiple communications personnel working at any given time to enable the management of several simultaneously occurring emergencies.

Question Six

The Westchester County Department of Public Safety presently provides, in the Town of Ossining, the following programs:

"Your Cop"

- o individual police officers assigned to neighborhoods as "your cop"
- questions or concerns of residents and business owners are addressed by the police officer assigned to their particular neighborhood
- DPS has responded to over 100 "your cop" requests since assuming responsibility for the program in 2011
- o representative sampling of reports generated from program attached

Dark House Monitoring

- upon request of residents who will be away from home, DPS will visit premises approximately once per duty tour and conduct an exterior inspection to create a deterrence to criminal activity thereat and to determine whether criminal activity or any damage to property has occurred
- DPS has received and responded to approximately 100 such requests, resulting in over 2,700 inspections, since assuming responsibility for the program in 2011
- representative sampling of reports generated from program attached

Homeowner's Association Liaison

- Municipal Policing Liaison Officer assigned to this function
- meets periodically with HOA representatives
- police officers assigned to town patrol periodically attend HOA meetings

Monitor False Alarms / Data Recording and Reporting

- all false alarm reports are recorded in the DPS electronic records management system
- o such records are then provided to town for collection of fines
- o representative sampling of reports generated from program attached

- Community Education/Outreach Programs
 - DPS conducts such programs on a periodic basis as interest or issues of note demand
 - such programs have included an introduction to the County Police, coyote awareness, "senior scams," and disaster/emergency preparedness

Additional Explanation

- The within proposal constitutes an offer to enter into negotiation of an intermunicipal agreement (IMA) with the Town of Ossining to provide the police services described in the RFP and the execution of such an IMA is subject to the approval of the Westchester County Board of Legislators and the Westchester County Board of Acquisition and Contract.
- This proposal is made with the expectation that language, similar to that which is
 included in the present Town IMA for the provision of police services to the effect that
 the amount paid for the County's services under an IMA for police services will reflect
 that cost of providing same and that adjustments will be made from the town to the
 county, or vice versa, on a periodic basis will be included in the proposed IMA.
- With respect to Specification No. 1, "Scope of Work," this proposal will accommodate such additional dwelling units and structures as may be developed and occupied during the period of the contract.
