PUBLIC OPINION SURVEY

The public opinion survey was prepared for the *Town of Ossining Comprehensive Plan* as a means of soliciting input from residents, local businesses and property owners. It provided an opportunity in the planning process for the public in the Unincorporated Town of Ossining¹ to identify their opinions on various topics and issues, such as: community appearance, economic development, services, traffic and commuting, housing, quality of life, and the most pressing planning issues.

The public opinion survey was mailed to 2,229 residents, merchants/tenants and property owners in the Unincorporated Area of the Town of Ossining. Careful attention was given to developing a database for the mailing which targeted people within the unincorporated areas of the Town, and not property owners in the Villages of Briarcliff Manor and Ossining.

A total of **328** surveys were received and tabulated for this analysis, which results in a **14.7% response rate**. The strong response rate indicates that local residents, businesses and property owners were interested in expressing their opinions on issues of concern to them and identifying subject matters for consideration in the Comprehensive Plan. In addition to responding to options listed for each survey question, most respondents took the opportunity to provide written comments for many of survey questions — several respondents actually attached pages to their survey with more written comments. [*Note: several surveys received after the extended deadline were reviewed but not included in the tabulated results.*]

The following considerations were made in tabulating and analyzing the surveys for the Ossining Comprehensive Plan:

• Some of the respondents did not answer all of the questions, or all of the choices for each question. Hence, the total numbers for each question may not be the same.

The Town of Ossining includes the incorporated Villages of Ossining and Briarcliff and the areas outside of these Villages. For the purposes of this document and the Comprehensive Plan project, we are dealing with the Unincorporated Town of Ossining (as depicted on the map).

- A number of surveys were received after the extended deadline, but during the period of tabulation. Therefore, every effort was made to include all of the returned surveys.
- The written comments provided for many of the questions have been incorporated into the appropriate sections of the survey analysis. For this survey analysis report, most of the written comments have been grouped together and summarized for clarification. [Note: there is a separate, large file with a compilation of all the written comments for each survey question. A copy of this file has been provided to Village officials for their review in connection to this survey analysis report.]
- In some of the survey analysis, if written comments were received by several respondents for the same question, the responses were totaled. For example, in Question 9, many of the responses received regarding the quality of new development were "good", "poor" etc. Rather than repeating the same responses over again, similar responses were totaled and appear in parenthesis at the end of the response.

In addition to the overall Survey results, an effort was made to target specific interest groups to find out how their responses matched the overall Town responses. Of the 146 surveys distributed to property owners around the ORM zoning district, 20 were returned (13.7% response rate). In contrast, of the 52 surveys sent to merchants/tenants and non-residential property owners on North State Road and Executive Boulevard, only 4 were returned (7.7% response rate).

The Public Opinion Survey provided options which respondents could select for each of the questions. Most choices were ranking, options or opportunities to write comments about a specific matter (often as an expansion on the question options). For Questions 1, 9 and 11 there were five choices: Strongly Agree, Agree, No Opinion, Disagree, or Strongly Disagree.
