# C. Considering a proposal to amend the Town of Ossining Zoning Map for Dr. Yosef Haroush-513 North State Road

Councilmember Harter moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Tawil that the following resolution be approved:

Whereas, Dr. Yosef Haroush has submitted an application for a Zoning map amendment in accordance with the attached map to change the zoning designation of the easterly portion of the property at 513 North State Road from R-30 One-Family Residence District to GB General Business District, which property is designated on the Tax Assessment Map of the Town of Ossining as Section 90.19, Block 2, Lot 8; and

Whereas, Dr. Yosef Haroush proposes to construct a building and associated parking area, landscaping, etc. on the areas of the property to be rezoned General Business, and to relocate his animal health center from 438 North State Road to 513 North State Road; and

Whereas, the Planning Board issued a report dated March 25, 2009 indicating that the proposed rezoning would be reasonable and appropriate and that the Town Board should consider enacting said rezoning; and

Whereas, the Westchester County Planning Department indicated that the proposed action was a matter for local determination; and

Whereas, the Town Board of the Town of Ossining declared itself Lead Agency for review of the subject application in accordance with the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), determining the proposed action to be an Unlisted Action; and

Whereas, on June 9, 2009, the Town Board opened a public hearing on the subject zoning map amendment, at which time all persons interested were given an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to the zoning map amendment and the public hearing was closed on June 9, 2009,

Now, therefore be it Resolved, the Town Board, acting as lead agency, hereby adopts the attached Negative Declaration and has determined that the proposed action will not have any significant adverse impact upon the environment thereby ending the SEQRA review process, and be it further

Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Ossining hereby approves the proposed amendment to the Zoning Map to change the zoning designation of the easterly portion of the property at 513 North State Road from R-30 One-Family Residence District to GB General Business District, which property is designated on the Tax Assessment Map of the Town of Ossining as Section 90.19, Block 2, Lot 8.

# D. Adoption of Local Law No. 1 of 2009 – Taxation of Converted Condominiums

Councilmember Tawil moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Wilcher that the following be approved:

Resolved, by the Town Board of the Town of Ossining, Westchester County, New York, as follows:

#### LOCAL LAW 1 - 2009

A LOCAL LAW amending the Code of the Town of Ossining, Chapter 180 thereof, entitled Taxation, to enact a new Article IX entitled Taxation of Converted Condominiums

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Ossining, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 241 of the Code of the Town of Ossining entitled Taxation is hereby amended to enact a new Article IX thereof entitled Taxation of Converted Condominiums, to read and provide as follows:

# Article IX Taxation of Converted Condominiums

Section 180-32. Taxation of Converted Condominiums

- A. This local law is adopted pursuant to Chapter 293 of the Laws of the State of New York 1997 which enacted Section 581.1.(c) of the Real Property Tax Law and Section 339-y.1.(f) of the Real Property Tax Law for the purpose of preventing lower assessments of converted condominiums.
- B. In accordance with Section 581.1.(c) of the Real Property Tax Law and Section 339-y.1.(f) of the Real Property Tax Law, neither Section 581.1.(a) of the Real Property Tax Law nor Section 339-y.1.(b) of the Real Property Tax Law shall apply to any converted condominium units in the Town of Ossining. A "converted condominium" shall mean a dwelling unit held in condominium form of ownership that has previously been on an assessment roll as a dwelling unit in other than condominium form of ownership and has not been previously subject to the provisions of Section 581.1.(a) of the Real Property Tax Law or Section 339-y.1.(b) of the Real Property Tax Law.

<u>Section 2</u>. Except as otherwise provided herein, all other provisions of Chapter 180 Taxation shall remain the same.

<u>Section 3</u>. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon publication and posting as required by law.

## E. Retirement-Deputy Town Clerk

Councilmember Tawil moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Wilcher that the following resolution be approved:

Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Ossining hereby accepts, with regret, the retirement of Patricia Fracassi as Deputy Town Clerk, effective June 19, 2009.

#### F. Collateral Source Legislation-Settlement of Tort Claims

Councilmember Tawil moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Wilcher that the following resolution be approved:

Whereas, under current state law, when public employees are hurt on the job, taxpayer dollars are used to pay the injured employee twice for the same lost future earnings; and

Whereas, a new bill has been proposed by New York State Trial Lawyers Association and has been introduced to legislation (S.4080-A by Senator Schneiderman/A.7504-A by M. of A. Weinstein); and which if passed, would end the unfair double recoveries against public employers and removes the impediment to the settlement of tort actions: and

Whereas, the bill would protect all participants of the lawsuit , and would not require payment from the employer to a health benefit provider or collateral source payor-however if there is a statutory right to such reimbursement, then settlement is encouraged;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Ossining supports these bills and urges participation in this bill by lawmakers to vote this into law; and be it further

Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Peter J. Kiernan, Counsel to the Governor; New York State Senate Majority Leader Malcolm A. Smith; New York State Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver; Senator Elizabeth Little; Assemblywoman Janet Duprey; and Barry P. Schwartz Senior Counsel New York City Law Department.

#### VII. VISITOR RECOGNITION

Bobby Williams, Spring Street, discussed a variety of historic issues.

Ingrid Rodrigues a resident near Ryder Park lodged complaints relative to the condition of Ryder Park including the grass not being cut; the tennis courts locked due to poor condition as well as the need for recycling bins. They have not weed whacked around the pond for a long time. The poison ivy should be cut back during the winter months. Supervisor Borgia stated that the Board has been working on a remediation plan thru the Friends of the Parks. Councilmember Harter invited her to attend the next Rec Advisory Meeting which will be held again in the fall at 7 p.m. The meetings are held on the second Monday of the month at the Joseph G. Caputo Community Center.

Councilmember Harter stated that the situation at the State Senate is making a laughing stock of New York State throughout the United States. They are getting nothing done and their behavior is childish and hurtful to the entire State. Please write your Senator and ask that they resolve this situation now.
