I. CALL TO ORDER – PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE – ROLL CALL

The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Ossining was held on March 8, 2016 at the Birdsall-Fagan Police Court/Facility, 86-88 Spring Street in Ossining. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Supervisor Dana Levenberg. Members of the Board present were: Councilmembers Karen M. D'Attore, Elizabeth R. Feldman, Kim L. Jeffrey and Northern Wilcher, Jr. Also present were Town Counsels Christie Tom Addona and Roisin Grzegorzewski, Budget Officer Madeline Zachacz and Town Clerk Mary Ann Roberts.

II. Public Hearings:

- **Public Hearing in the Matter of Local Law #3 of 2016- Repealing Chapter 85 of the Town Code Regarding SEQRA Processes & Public Hearing in the Matter of Local Law #4 of 2016- Creating a New Type 1 List for Actions Under SEQRA**

At 7:31 P.M., the Public Hearings were opened.

Supervisor Levenberg stated the following:

Public Hearings: We have three public hearings tonight. This first one is a continuation of a public hearing that was opened in February. The reopened public hearing is to repeal Chapter 85 of our Town Code in order to make sure our State Environmental Quality Review Act, or SEQRA regulations, are in compliance with New York State's. The State had updated its laws subsequent to many of ours and legal precedence favors the State's laws. As such, we are recommending repealing our Chapter 85 so we can default to the state regulations. The second hearing was to introduce Local Law #4 to add Type 1 actions to the state's list. These additional Type 1 actions will mirror those included in Chapter 85 which were more stringent than the state's. We are hoping to adopt both local law #3 and #4 simultaneously to make sure there is no gap in our Type 1 actions list.

Town Counsel Christie Tom Addona stated that the goal here is to make sure what the Town Code says is in compliance with the state regulations. There are some rights that municipality would have to create their own type one list. Which are lists of actions that are more likely to have a significant adverse environmental impact that the municipalities can adopt at a lower level.

Supervisor Levenberg explained that we had sent this to the environmental advisory committee to get some feedback which we had taken into account in adopting local law number 4 and then they had further questions related to the wetlands. Ms. Addona addressed these concerns.

Councilmember Jeffrey questioned if we know of any codes within the Town that are stronger and/or ridged without superseding what the states says?

Ms. Addona explained what we have drafted in the local law we did go through the EAC's comments and they did provide the Town Board with frame work of what to start working off of. The EAC does have a type 1 list and this is why we wanted to do it simultaneously so that there is no gap in not having those more protective provisions. We did incorporated all of it into the law that is before the Board.

Ms. Addona also stated that it was brought to your attention before this meeting and those comments were forwarded to the EAC to make sure we were in line of what we were explaining this evening and what we can do under state regulations. We had to make sure that whatever was a Type 1 could not be already be identified as a Type 2. We made a slight edit to subsection 6. The EAC has been aware of this action and she is not aware of any concerns.

At 7:43 P.M., Councilmember D'Attore moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Wilcher that the Public Hearings be closed.

- Public Hearing in the Matter of Local Law #5 of 2016- Veteran's Exemption Adjustment

At 7:44 P.M., the Public Hearings were opened.

Supervisor Levenberg stated the following:

The third local law we discussed tonight pertains to our veteran's tax exemptions which need to be modified as we adopt readjusted values based on the town wide revaluation, on which Town Assessor Fernando Gonzalez was kind enough to elaborate.

Town Assessor, Fernando Gonzalez provided a background of the various veteran's exemptions. The exemption that we are discussing tonight Eligible Funds exemption. We have 284 Veteran's who are enrolled in this exemption. The law will allow the veteran's continue to receive the exemption at the same level. The maximum exemption recently allowed was \$7,500.00. The real property tax law has this written into it.

Supervisor Levenberg stated that this is the least we can do for all the Veteran's that have sacrificed for us.

Mr. Gonzalez explained that this can be a very complex process. This will be a change in level factor that will be calculated by the state.

At 7:52 P.M., Councilmember Wilcher moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Feldman that the Public Hearings be closed.

III. SPECIAL PRESENTATION:

- Presentation by Tom Warren on Levy of Village Water Liens

Town Comptroller Tom Warren gave a brief presentation to review the delinquent water rents which will now be levied as part of the town tax bill for those properties in the unincorporated area. We will have a resolution accepting these liens later this evening. If there are unpaid charges greater than 3 months can be provided to the Town/County Tax Roll in April. As they are collected they would be remitted back to the Village.

IV. ANNOUNCEMENTS

Supervisor Levenberg read the following statement:

Opening Announcements:

Welcome to our first meeting of Women's History Month 2016 and it's also International Women's Day. I am so excited to be serving as a part of history in our communities. We currently have female mayors of both the Village of Ossining (Victoria Gearity) and of Briarcliff (Lori Sullivan) as well as a female Town Supervisor—yours truly--and our own Town Board has a 4-1 ratio of women to men (yes Northern, you are outnumbered!!), and Rika Levin sits on the Village Board. We have our Town Clerk, Mary Ann Roberts, and our Tax Receiver, Gloria Fried, and one of three of our town justices, Nancy Koba. Additionally, we have Francesca Connolly, our Supreme Court Justice. Four more of our female representatives include Westchester County Legislator Catherine Borgia, State Assemblywoman Sandy Galef, United States Congresswoman Nita Lowey, and US Senator Kirsten Gillibrand. On the third floor at 16 Croton Ave., the vast majority of staff is female. Clearly, here in Ossining, we are making significant inroads into breaking the glass ceiling, and for that I am very proud of our community—for showing you have the confidence and belief that there is no reason, anymore, to favor one gender in leadership over another. It's also a time to remember those who have laid the foundation for this to be possible today, and to thank them for the hard fought battles among the people, before Congress, and in our courts. We will continue to carry the torch so that all young women know the sky's the limit. Next, we will have a long series of budget adjustments for the 2015 budget year, including some capital projects. These are regular adjustments made throughout the year, and then a few more at the end of the year to clean up any over-expended lines. Many of these come from tax certiorari claims which we have settled, and now need to pay, and this spreads them proportionately across the funds. We hope with our reval we will see fewer credible tax certs as our assessments will be rock solid.

Next we have a resolution for Earth Day that makes an allowance for the Captain Lawrence Brewery to sell alcohol in a town park. Normally this is prohibited, but for certain large events we do make exceptions. I hope you will all take the time on April 16th to join us at Engel Park for Earth Day where Green Ossining will be highlighting water, its many, many benefits, and the need for all of us to conserve it, as well as take time to enjoy our beautiful Hudson River, visit tables of local artisans and organizations.

For several years now, the Town has been interested in offering the option of credit card payments for fees charged in some of our offices, such as the Clerk's Office and the Building Department. The subsequent resolution will allow Elavon, a credit card processor who works with many local banks, including ours, to price out a package for us.

Next, we have two resolutions between Teamsters Local 456 and the Town to vote on two contract-related stipulations. We enjoy working with both of our bargaining units and look forward to a continued productive relationship.

Now for a few announcements:

Last week, Maddi Zachacz and I attended a forum on unfunded mandates hosted by the Town of New Castle. EJ McMahon from the Empire Center highlighted the major drivers behind out of scale property taxes in New York. His premise is that the Taylor Law and the Triborough Amendment are the key components of these unsustainable costs, and that a tax cap which does not keep pace with these costs puts local municipalities and school districts in an impossible situation. The state must address these drivers to help control costs locally. New Castle has also undertaken a very detailed study of mandates affecting their taxing entities. They highlighted 10 of the most significant mandates. We are hopeful that by working together to advocate for a response from the state we can make progress in the future.

We also, along with many of our Town employees, attended the kick-off of the Employee Wellness program coordinated by Recreation Superintendent Chris Soi and Village Personnel Director Linda McMahon. Besides being well attended, it seems like a very exciting program that will benefit all of those working in the Town, Village, schools and library, and we look forward to working out, eating healthfully and staying less stressed together.

We are still finishing up our LED lighting project throughout the Town and Village. Just today, we received a call from a gentleman who says he is an amateur astronomer who lives in

the Village and is so excited about the new lights and their positive impact on our night sky. Good news indeed.

Although, Earth Day is right around the corner on April 16th, there is still time to sign up for a booth. Please contact Suzie Ross at GreenOssining.org for more information and don't forget to put the date on your calendar.

Also, the first Annual Health and Wellness Day will take place at Engel Park on May 7th from 10-4. If you are interested in a booth for that event, check our website later this week for a link that will get you registration information and how to contact Milly Morabito, who is chairing that event.

We will launch the Mind, Body, Spirit Ossining Project that day with a number of local fitness professionals hosting demos and sessions for the public. I hope you will join us.

This weekend our Town Highway Superintendent Michael G. O'Connor will be representing the Town and marching in the Sleepy Hollow St. Patrick's Day Parade as an Aide to the Grand Marshall on Sunday, March 13th – step off is at 1:30 on Main Street in Tarrytown. The Reviewing Stand is on Beekman Ave, in Sleepy Hollow. All local municipalities are invited to participate in this regional event. We wish everyone a very happy St. Pat's Day—get your green on!

Also, I had a chance to join many community members at opening night for the Living Art Event at the Steamer Firehouse last Friday. I have to recommend that you take the time to attend one of these performances to see what great artists, talented playwrights, actors, and directors we have at this one-of-a-kind event. Go to WCTheater.org or Ossiningartscouncil.org for ticket information. Shows are Fridays and Saturdays at 8:00, Sundays at 3:00 for the rest of March.

*I would be remiss if I did not mention that the Ossining High School Drama Club will proudly present the musical *In the Heights* this Wednesday at 4pm (their Open Dress Rehearsal), and Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 10, 11 & 12th at 7pm in the beautifully restored Ossining High School auditorium. Some reserved seats can be purchased, but most are free. I have an inside line on this and it is sure to be an amazing show!*

*This Thursday night at 6:15 pm, The Ossining Documentary and Discussion Series is showing *The True Cost* which looks at the real cost of the clothing we wear. Join some of our local celebrities, including Eco Bags Founder and CEO Sharon Rowe and Amy Hall, Director of Social Consciousness and a member of the Leadership Forum for clothing designer Eileen Fischer, for a thoughtful discussion after the film.*

*The Ethical Society of Northern Westchester is hosting a film series and discussion on *Dying with Dignity*. C. Resolution – Authorizing Levy of Unpaid Water Charges on Town Tax Roll

Councilmember Wilcher moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Feldman that the following be approved:

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Inter-Municipal Agreement ("Water IMA") dated January 1, 2002, the Village of Ossining supplies water to the Unincorporated area of the Town of Ossining ("Town Outside") and directly bills consumers in the Town Outside for water supplied pursuant to the Water IMA; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Water IMA, any water charge that is delinquent for three or more months shall be levied against the delinquent property by the Town and shall be subject to penalty in the manner provided by law, in which event, upon

collection by the Town, the Town shall remit the amount collected to the Village of Ossining; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 198 of the Town Law, the Town of Ossining is authorized to levy unpaid water charges against delinquent properties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that any water charges to a customer outside of the Village of Ossining corporate limits and in the Town of Ossining that is delinquent for three or more months shall be levied against the delinquent property and shall be subject to penalty in the manner provided by law,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Treasurer, on behalf of the Village Clerk of the Village of Ossining, shall file with the Supervisor of the Town of Ossining, as required by law, statements showing unpaid water charges to customers outside of the Village of Ossining corporate limits, but within the Town of Ossining, which are delinquent for three or more months and that such statements shall contain a brief description of the property upon which the water was used, the names of the persons or corporations liable to pay for the same and the amounts chargeable to each for the purposes of levy and enforcement under "Water Rents" and upon receipt of such statement, the Supervisor will transmit said statement of delinquent water charges to the Receiver of Taxes for levy against those delinquent properties.

Mr. Mike Gordon Co-Chair of Sustainable Westchester was present to discuss the contract with CCA. Sustainable Westchester was able to sign a contract with a fixed price for 24 months. There are two choices 7.381 or 7.681. The average price from Con Ed was 8.1 cents. This is about 5% -10% savings for the next 2 years. The decision that the Town has is what is the default?

Supervisor Levenberg clarified that for those residents who live in the Village of Ossining and Town of Ossining who currently have Con Ed supply customers you will automatically be switched shifted into CCA supplier. The choice of the board is are you going to shifted automatically into the 100% green which is the 7.681/kilowatt/hour or 7.381/kilowatt/hour which is considered standard mix. The consumers will still have the option to opt out completely and go back with Con Ed if they want to or opt down or up depending on what the Board chooses.

Mr. Gordon advised the Board that they should make the decision next week.

Supervisor Levenberg questioned when will we see the new bill?

Mr. Gordon replied May 1st. Notices will go out approximately March 26th, 27th or 28th.

All members of the board were in agreement with moving forward with this.
