The Special Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Ossining was held on May 15, 2018 at the Birdsall-Fagan Police Court Facility, 86-88 Spring Street in Ossining. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 p.m. by Supervisor Dana A. Levenberg. Members of the Board present were: Councilmembers Karen M. D'Attore, Elizabeth R. Feldman, Jackie G.
