



Which part of the Town do you live in?







Are you familiar with Buck Johnson Park?




Are you familiar with Sally Swope Sitting Park?







The pond in the park used to attract blue herons, but since the sewer pipes were brought down that length of the park to N. State Road, the pond has died. 



If it meant an increase to my taxes, no. I'm living on SS and can pay my bills now.


