#### I. CALL TO ORDER

A Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Ossining was held on February 26, 2008 in the Police/Court Facility, 86-88 Spring Street in Ossining. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Supervisor John Chervokas. Other members of the Board present were: David Krieger, Northern Wilcher, Martha Dodge and Geoffrey Harter. Also present were: Thomas Beirne, Town Attorney and Mary Ann Roberts, Town Clerk.

II. PUBLIC HEARING – In the matter of the Application for a Cabaret License-Unique Affairs at Mansion Hill, 25 Studio Hill Road, Briarcliff Manor

The Public Hearing was opened at 7:32 p.m.

Mr. Guy DeMeo owner of Unique Affairs on Mansion Hill was in attendance at the Public Hearing and advised the Board that everything at his establishment has basically stayed the same. He did advise the Board that his exist date from Unique Affairs on Mansion Hill is June 30, 2008. Councilmember Harter requested that the Board only issue the 2008 Cabaret License to expire on the same date as his exit date. Town Attorney Beirne stated that this amendment should be noted at the time of adoption of the resolution

At 7:50 p.m., Councilmember Wilcher moved and it was seconded by Councilmember Harter that the hearing be closed.

Councilmember Krieger announced that a concert by the Scarborough Singers will be hosted by the Ossining Public Library on March 2, 2008 beginning at 3 p.m. Councilmember Krieger also attended a Global Warming Conference over at the County on Tuesday. Councilmember Dodge announced the "Relay for Life of Ossining Kick Off" which will take place on Wednesday, February 27, 2008 at the Ossining Public Library at 7 p.m. in the Theater Room. This event will take place at Cedar Lane Park on June 20 -21 from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m.

WHEREAS the applicable law provides that the remaining members of the Town Board are to appoint a person to fill the said vacancy, pending the election of a Supervisor in November 2008 to serve for the balance of Supervisor Chervokas' term; and

WHEREAS the Town Board, after careful deliberation at its public work session following Supervisor Chervokas' announcement, has determined that the person best qualified to assume the duties of Town Supervisor at this time is Council Member Martha Dodge; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board accepts the resignation of John V. Chervokas from the position of Town Supervisor and acknowledges his more than 10 years of outstanding leadership of and dedication to the Town of Ossining; and be it further

RESOLVED that Martha Dodge be, and she hereby is, appointed to the position of Ossining Town Supervisor, effective March 1, 2008; and be it further

RESOLVED that Martha Dodge shall serve until the close of business on December 31, 2008, at which point she will be succeeded by the candidate elected at the Town-wide election to be held in November 2008.

#### F. Affordable Housing – Interfaith Council for Action, Inc.

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Planning Board of the Town of Ossining, on behalf of the Town Board, has conducted an inquiry for the purpose of identifying the affordable housing program administrator which is most qualified to oversee the Town's program so as to accomplish its goals at reasonable cost to the taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board Chairman, upon completion of his inquiry, recommended the appointment of the Interfaith Council for Action, Inc. ("IFCA") as the Town's affordable housing administrator; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Town of Ossining hereby appoints the Interfaith Council for Action, Inc. ("IFCA") as its affordable housing administrator in accordance with their cost for services as delineated in their letter of October 16. 2007 and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor be, and he/she hereby is, authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town of Ossining, any and all documents necessary and appropriate to carry out the terms of this resolution.

#### L. Approving Cabaret License - Unique Affairs at Mansion Hill

### M. <u>Authorizing surveying for Stormytown Sewer District Pump Station</u> <u>Elimination</u>

Whereas, the sewage pump station for the Stormytown Sewer District is in poor condition and does not meet New York State Department of Health and Westchester County Department of Health standards; and

Whereas, the Town Engineer proposed that a land surveyor be hired to create maps with aerial photography of the route, property lines from tax maps, and topographic information from USGS maps, which will help to determine the course of the sewer, and

Whereas, the Town Engineer solicited surveying proposals and after reviewing them, determined that Thomas C. Merritts Land Surveyors, P.C. of Pleasantville, New York was the most reliable, skilled and cost effective proposal received at a price not to exceed \$12,000.00;

Now, therefore be it resolved, that the Town Board of the Town of Ossining authorizes Thomas C. Merritts, Land Surveyors, PC to proceed with the surveying work for the elimination of the pump station at the Stormytown Sewer District at a price not to exceed \$12,000
