


Town of Ossining Contains Three Municipalities

- Town of Ossining
 - Village of Ossining
 - Village of Briarcliff Manor (87% geographically)
 - Unincorporated Area
 - Including Election Districts 17 & 20
- Village of Briarcliff Manor
 - 87% is in the Town of Ossining
 - 13% is in the Town of Mount Pleasant

Where Do Your Property Taxes Go?

- Property Tax Distribution
 - Westchester County: Around 12%
 - Town of Ossining: Less than 2%
 - School Districts: Between 61% and 70%
 - Local Municipality: Between 15% and 26%
 - Village Tax OR
 - Unincorporated Town Tax + Special Districts

How Much of the Unincorporated Area is in Question?



- School Districts, Post Office Addresses and Political Boundaries will not change
- Special Districts will be preserved, and residents of Election Districts 17 & 20 will continue to pay for them
- Remaining portions of Unincorporated Area will not automatically become part of the Village of Ossining

- Residents of Election Districts 17 & 20:
 - Will now be taxed for BOTH Ossining Public and Briarcliff Village Libraries
 - Will still be responsible for their proportionate share of all existing Town of Ossining debt

- Residents of Election Districts 17 & 20:
 - Will still be responsible for their proportionate share of all existing Town of Ossining contracts

 Will still be taxed based on property assessment value for purposes of calculating all Town of Ossining special district tax levy amounts

- Residents of Election Districts 17 & 20 Will Now PAY TWICE for the following:
 - Refuse Collection (Garbage and Recycling)
 - Municipal Water
 - Municipal Sewer
 - Municipal Street Lighting
 - Police
 - Ambulance Protection
 - Fire Protection
 - Libraries

- Remainder of Unincorporated Area's taxes to increase significantly (20%)
 - \$20.16/ thousand assessed
 - Roughly \$414 per household increase

- Village of Briarcliff Manor residents to absorb Town of Ossining debt previously incurred by residents of 17 & 20
 - 33.68% of 2014 Unincorporated Fund Debt + Interest: **\$118,556**
 - 33.68% of 2014 Highway Fund Debt + Interest: \$29,608
 - 33.68% of 2014 Unincorporated Contractual Costs: \$59,868
 - 33.68% of 2014 Police Contract: \$845,252
 - <u>Entirety</u> of North State Road Sewer Debt: **\$55,156**
 - TOTAL Debt Incurred by Election Districts 17 & 20 in 2014: \$1,108,440

What is the Rationale?

The Town and Village Boards must consider whether the residents and taxpayers in Election Districts 17 & 20 are already receiving vital, valued, appropriate and complete municipal services.

- Parks and Recreation Department services:
 - Park facilities, including a water spray park
 - Youth recreation programs and services, including summer camp
 - Adult recreation programs and services
 - Year-round swimming pool

- Senior services:
 - Senior Nutrition program: lunches and home meal delivery
 - Senior activities and programs
 - RUOK daily phone call service
 - Call-a-Cab program
 - Town Chauffer program

Highway Department services:

- Maintenance of Town streets and roads
- Maintenance of Town drainage systems/ storm sewers
- Maintenance of Town sanitary sewer system and pumping stations
- Snow removal and ice control on Town roads
- Leaf pick-up
- Tree removal and trimming of trees in Town rightof-ways
- Bulk trash collection

- Police protection and emergency response services
- Fire protection services
- Ambulance and emergency medical services, including EMT & paramedic services

- Engineering services for Town functions and projects
- Clean filtered drinking water
- Sanitary sewer collection system and pumping stations
- Street lighting
- Sanitation garbage and recyclables pick-up
- Access to Metro North train station and commuter parking

- Building Department services for building safety and code enforcement
- Planning and Zoning Department services
- Other general government support services, such as assessments, tax collection, Town Clerk, Town legal, Town finance, Town executive, etc.
- Accountable elected officials

- In addition, being annexed into the Village of Briarcliff Manor will not change the following educational and other services that are currently provided to residents and taxpayers in Election Districts 17 & 20:
 - Primary and secondary education from the Ossining Union Free School District
 - Public library from the Ossining Public Library

Things to Consider

- How long would annexation take?
- How much would it cost?
- Is there a clear benefit to annexation for all stakeholders?
- Would annexation harm <u>any</u> taxpayers?
- Would Residents of 17 & 20 see appreciable savings?
- Would Village of Briarcliff Manor Residents pay more in taxes?
- Would Village of Ossining Residents pay more in taxes?
- Would this be a smart choice for everyone involved?
