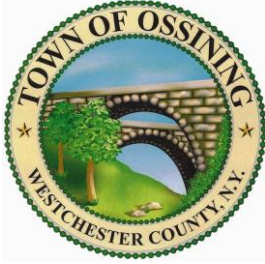

**B. Ossining Children’s Center, 32 State Street, Ossining NY 10562**

**(2) Public Service projects, presented by Director of Development Shawn Cribari**

- Child care tuition assistance for low and moderate income families:
  - Up to \$225,000 (up to \$75,000 annually for three years) for tuition assistance, with the Ossining Children’s Center contributing matching funds from DSS child care subsidies;
- Enrichment programming for children from low and moderate income families:
  - Up to \$75,000 (up to \$25,000 annually for three years) for enrichment programming, with the Corporation contributing matching funds from private donations to OCC’s annual fund.

**C. Gullotta House, 72 North State Road #175, Briarcliff Manor NY 10510**

**(2) Public Service projects, presented by President/ Founder Matt Gullotta**

- Meals to senior/ homebound/ quarantined residents- \$700/week (\$5/meal)
- Grab-and-go meals- \$1800/week (\$8/meal)
