

## LOCAL LAW NO. 9 of 2016

A Local Law known and cited as the Amendment to Extend Interim Development Moratorium within the Unincorporated Town of Ossining

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Ossining as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Purpose and Intent. Previously the Town Board of the Town of Ossining (“Town Board”) adopted a four month Interim Development Moratorium beginning on June 7, 2016 to preserve its intended objectives and ensure future possible implementation of new zoning regulations it may deem necessary based upon recommendations made in the Town’s Comprehensive Plan to analyze planning and zoning issues in certain areas within the Town of Ossining. Since the adoption of the Interim Development Moratorium, the Town’s Consultant Planner has submitted a Draft Planning and Zoning Analysis which has been discussed and reviewed by the Town Board in depth, and based upon the Town Board’s input, the Town’s Consultant Planner has made substantial modifications and revisions to the draft local law, which process is still continuing and is anticipated to be completed approximately at the end of 2016, at which time the Town Board will hold a public hearing and receive public input and make any further necessary revisions prior to voting on the local law. Therefore, in order to continue the purpose of the Interim Development Moratorium to the completion of the process, it is necessary to extend the Interim Development Moratorium for an additional four months.

**SECTION 2.** Local Law No. 6 of 1016 is hereby amended by modifying Section 5 to read as follows, with such Local Law remaining unchanged in all other respects:

“Section 5. Term. This Local Law shall be in effect for a period of eight months from June 7, 2016.”

**SECTION 3.** Validity. The invalidity of any provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity of any other portion of this Local Law which can be given effect without such invalid provision.

**SECTION 4.** Effective Date. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the Secretary of State, and is subject to review and renewal by resolution of the Town Board for an additional period of time, effective immediately.
